Administrative Fee	Applies to families using an Alliance program. Includes coordination of services, program development/ maintenance, administrative services, communications, operations, family outreach, preparation and support.	Due upon completion of the home study or when a home study is submitted for review.	\$5,100
Second Program/ Double-Track Administration Fee	Applies to families using an Alliance program who change programs or who want to keep their application open in one program but want to apply to another program as well. **In addition, all required fees of second program are due.	Due when a family changes programs or adds a second program.	\$500
Dossier Preparation Fee	Applies to families using an Alliance program. Includes preparation, coordination, communication and mailings related to preparing a dossier.	Due upon completion of the home study or when a home study is submitted for review.	\$1,500

Foreign Country Fee	Includes dossier processing, translation, presentation and communication with government officials, obtaining information about potential referrals, office and personnel expenses, adoption-related support.	Due prior to dossier being sent.	\$4,750
Placement Fee	Includes medical/ court costs, legal fees, child-related costs, operating costs in-country, preparation and processing documents, etc. **Additional fee applies when adopting more than one child.	Due when a referral is accepted.	\$9,750

Additional Expenses to Anticipate:

USCIS Application: \$835-\$865 for initial application

Travel Expenses: \$5,000-\$10,000 (including airfare, lodging, meals, expenses, drivers, translators, etc.)

Travel expenses vary depending on the time of year you travel, the number of people traveling, and the length of stay in country.

FBI Fingerprinting/ Approval, if applicable: \$18-\$50 per adult, depending on service used

Parent Education and Training: \$130-\$500

Medical Exam for Visa: \$75-\$500

Child's Visa: \$325

Adoption Visa (Colombia): \$265

Child's Passport and Photos: \$65-\$150

Adoption Finalization/ Re-finalization, if applicable: \$1,000-\$1,500

Expedited Home Study Fee: Additional \$600

Insufficient Funds Fee: \$50

Additional Mileage: Additional mileage fees will apply for applicants whose social worker will need to travel more than 100 miles each way for home visits.
